The team pauses for fish and chips and whispers to each other across the expanse of St. Paul's Cathedral, where acoustics are miraculous. This classically beautiful picture book contains a gatefold illustration of life along the Thames and provides the ideal appetizer for young armchair travelers. Ages five to seven.
