Hannibal advocates for participatory research, the longstanding tradition of amateur naturalists engaging in whale watching, bee counting, tide-pool monitoring, and other forms of nature observation. The data collected can then be shared on iNaturalist, Google Earth Outreach, Google Maps, and similar technologies which "allow us to observe with consequence." Part personal adventure story and natural history, Hannibal proves herself to be an inspiring writer.
