Its set in Tibet, where Shan Tao Yun, a former Chinese cop, must find a killer in order to save his imprisoned son.

The sixth in a series, *The Lord of Death* is beautifully written, full of intrigue, and **INSIGHTFUL IN ITS FRAMING** of the historical and contemporary issues between China and Tibet. Warning: some of the torture scenes are disturbing not only for their graphic depiction but also because they mirror what happens in present-day Tibet.
